BATTLE CREEK SELECTED FOR NEW, NATIONAL RECYCLING REWARD PROGRAM

Waste Management residential program offers citizens extra incentives to recycle

BATTLE CREEK, Mich., June 1, 2009 – Waste Management, North America's largest recycling and solid waste management company, has selected Battle Creek for a new customer rewards program called "Think Green Rewards." Battle Creek was selected because of its size, demographics and the city's long and distinguished history of community involvement in sustainability and recycling.

Think Green Rewards is designed to help the City of Battle Creek to meet long-term sustainability and recycling goals by offering residents an extra incentive to recycle. The new program allows Battle Creek residents to track their recycling activities on-line and earn Think Green Rewards points for using their recycling bin to divert materials – like aluminum, plastic, glass and cardboard – to reprocessing and reuse.

The Think Green Rewards catalog includes coupons for discounted movie tickets, free or discounted meals, video game rentals and other local Battle Creek-area entertainment values.

TGR is the second program the City of Battle Creek and Waste Management have partnered on this year. In April, they launched the Think Green® From Home program for Battle Creek residents to responsibly recycle compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) and batteries right from their home. The city purchased 5,000 battery recycling kits and 2,000 CFL recycling kits through Waste Management's program and offered them for free to city residents.

Some recycling kits are still available for free at the Battle Creek Public Works office (150 S Kendall St.), Monday through Friday, during normal business hours, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. There is a limit of one free CFL and one free battery kit recycling kit per household.
