

# CITY OF EMERYVILLE MULTI-FAMILY DISPOSAL & RECYCLING SERVICES

Contribute to a cleaner and greener Emeryville by participating in the services provided to all residents.





Recycle only loose empty/dry bottles, cans, paper and flattened cardboard.



Do not bag recyclables.

Place only food scraps, food soiled paper, and yard waste into your organics cart or bin.





No loose or opaque plastic bags.

## **Cart and Bin Set Out Information**



Wheel carts/bins to curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day. Collection will be provided from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Carts/bins may be set out for 24 hour period only for the purposes of collection.

Cart customers may place flattened cardboard (up to 4' x 4'), **used motor oil** (up to 3 gallons), and **oil filters** (up to three) between carts at the curb.

Cart customers may place **household batteries** in a clear plastic bag, seal shut and tape to the top of the gray recyclables cart.

**Service holidays** are Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Day. When holiday lands on weekday, collection will be one day later for rest of week.

# Need to Get Rid of More?



Multi-family properties are eligible for bulky item pickup twice a year (4x for 500 or more units). Service is dependent on size and location of the property. Property owners or managers, call WM at (510) 613-8710 to schedule a collection. Single-family neighborhoods, watch for annual April collection event.

## Have Hard to Dispose Items?

Property Managers can order free mail-back products for the safe disposal of household batteries, CFLs and fluorescent tubes. Visit www.wmlamptracker.com/Emeryville to place your order. For product assistance or to order by phone call 800-664-1434 or 510-613-8700. Communicate with your residents the location at your property to collect household battery and lamp products. When the containers are ready, use the box with pre-paid label to mail them back.

WM's **MedWaste Tracker** provides for the safe containment, collection, and destruction of used sharps in the convenience of your home with a pre-paid postage return box. Available at thinkgreenfromhome.com



**Holiday Trees** are collected the month of January. Trees must be CLEAN (no flocking, decorations or stands) and cut to less than 6' tall. Property owners/managers of large properties may call WM at (510) 613-8710 to receive a free roll-off box for holiday tree-cycling.

## State and County Composting and Recycling Laws

California State law, SB 1383, aims to keep food and other compostable materials ("organics") out of landfills to reduce emissions that contribute to climate change. In Alameda County, the law is implemented and enforced under the Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance. In addition to sorting correctly, business and multifamily properties must set up adequate collection service and place color-coded and labeled indoor compost and recycling bins next to all trash bins. ### Avoid Contamination and Overage Charges

Contamination surcharges will be implemented when incorrect materials are discovered in the recycling or compost carts or bins (after two warnings).
