# SB 1383 ORGANICS RECYCLING

Starting January 1, 2024, King City is taking a big step towards a more sustainable future by enforcing the compliance of SB 1383. This means that businesses and residents will play a crucial role in sorting organic waste from the trash to fight climate change.

## How do I avoid fines?

### 1 Sign up for Organics Services.

Generators must subscribe to organics collection service per State law, to divert food scraps and yard trimmings. This applies to businesses, multi-family properties, and residents. Call **(800) 321-8226** to sign up.

### 2 Educate employees and tenants with free on-site waste assessments and employee trainings.

### 3 File for a waiver.

Certain businesses can request a waiver if they meet eligibility criteria. To apply for a waiver, call Salinas Valley Recycles at **(831) 775-3000**.

## What Belongs in the Green Cart



### Food scraps

Cooked meat and bones, cheese, grains/baked goods, fruits and vegetables, eggshells, & coffee grounds



### Yard debris

Grass clippings, leaves, small tree branches no larger than 3" diameter



### Non-acceptable items

Trash, recyclables, liquids, gloves, plastic straws, treated wood, palm leaves, cactus, dirt, stone, concrete, and rock

## What Belongs in the Blue Cart



### Plastics

Empty bottles & rigid plastic containers (#1, #2 & #5 only)



### Metal / Aluminum

All metal beverage & food cans, empty aerosol cans, clean aluminum pans & foil



### Glass

Empty bottles & jars (Even broken)



### Mixed Clean & Dry Paper

Magazines, newspaper, cardboard, junk mail



Keep recyclables loose



No food or liquid
