WISHCYCLING & THE DANGER OF CONTAMINATION



"Wishcycling" or throwing non-recyclable materials in the recycling cart in the hopes they can be recycled may seem like a harmless and well-meaning habit, but it can lead to the whole batch of recyclables being thrown out as trash. It's important to keep trash and recyclables separated and, when in doubt – throw it out.

Recycling starts with proper sorting. Please remember to sort plastic materials by shape: bottles, jars, jugs, and tubs are generally accepted. Empty glass items, tin, aluminum and steel cans are also good to go. Make sure to always give it a good wipe to remove food residue or any liquid before placing them in your recycling cart.
