Now in Effect: SB 1383

Senate Bill 1383, the Short-Lived Climate Pollutants Reduction law, went into effect in the State of California on January 1, 2022. These regulations set a goal of reducing the State's landfilled organic waste by 75% by 2025. In order to achieve this goal, cities and counties must establish organics (food waste and green waste) recycling programs at ALL properties, including single family residential properties. In addition, cities and counties must facilitate a food rescue program that creates a 20% increase in the recovery of currently disposed edible food from grocery stores, restaurants and other large food generators to address food insecurity in the community. Food Recovery Program

Edible Food Generators must recover the maximum amount of edible food that would otherwise be discarded. If your business fits into one of the categories below, you will need to set up a food recovery program.

Tier 1 Businesses Effective January 1, 2022

- Grocery Stores and Supermarkets (10,000 square feet or greater)
- Food Service Providers
- Food Distributors
- Wholesale Food Vendors

Tier 2 Businesses Effective January 1, 2024

- Restaurants (equal to or greater than 5,000 square ft or 250 seats)
- Hotels (with at least 200 rooms and an on-site food facility)
- Health Facilities (with at least 100 beds and an on-site food facility).
- Large Venues/Events (2,000+ daily visitors)
- Local education agencies with an on-site food facility

Santa Barbara County's Mulch Program

Using mulch in your garden saves water and completes the green waste recycling loop.

- Mulch can be obtained for free from a "load your own" pile
- Mulch can be loaded into trucks/trailers for a minimum of \$31/load. A dual axle truck/trailer is required for mulch loads at the South Coast Recycling and Transfer Station
- Large amounts of mulch can be delivered for \$21/ton
