Got HHW? Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event

On **Saturday, April 15, 2022*** you can dispose of your household hazardous waste for **FREE** at the College of the Canyons South parking lot from **9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.**Acceptable items include: paint, motor oil, fertilizers, fluorescent tubes, CFL bulbs, batteries, automotive fluids, cleaning chemicals, unused or expired medications, sharps and more.

Please bring items in their original, labeled container (no more than 15 gallons permitted per trip).

Celebrate Earth Day By Recycling Right!

The materials you recycle at home, especially cardboard, are vital in the production of new materials. Paper mills rely on fiber for the manufacturing of items such as boxes for grocery and home delivery, tissue and paper towels. Here are some tips to help you recycle right:

- **1.** Break down cardboard boxes and, if needed, cut them up to fit in your recycling cart.
- **2.** Empty all bottles, cans and beverage cartons before recycling.
- **3.** Keep food and liquids out of your recycling.
- **4.** Place items loosely inside your recycling cart, no plastic bags.
- **5.** Disposable gloves, face masks, disinfectant wipes and any other Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) should be properly disposed of in your trash cart not your recycling cart. Visit **wm.com/recycleright** for more tips!

Sharps Home Delivery

Residents can safely dispose of needles, lancets and other sharps using WM's Sharps Mail Back Program. Contact customer service at **(661)259-2398** for your free container and it will be delivered directly to your door. Simply fill the kit and mail it back using the pre-paid postage label. Residents can request one free container per year (two for seniors). A second kit is available, upon request, for a \$5 co-pay. Additional containers are available at full price.



A Message from the City of Santa Clarita Food Waste Recycling – What to Expect

California passed a law, Senate Bill 1383, to improve air quality by reducing greenhouse gas emissions from organic waste disposal such as food and landscape waste. Landfilled organic waste decomposes and generates methane gas. This greenhouse gas is released into the atmosphere, affects air quality and contributes to global warming. The City of Santa Clarita already offers landscape waste or green waste recycling, however, to comply with this new mandate, communities will have to begin a Food Waste Recycling Program for residential customers. City of Santa Clarita will begin recycling food waste at home starting July 1, 2023. Please continue your current trash and recycling practices until we provide information that the program has launched.
